WHAT WE DO AS A LAND TRUST

Work with landowners interested in conservation and preservation of natural areas.

Hold and enforce conservation easements, which permanently limit how the land can be used, as directed by the landowner who created the easement.

Serve as a resource for landowners who want to be stewards of their land, who understand the value of natural areas, and who want to leave an enduring legacy.

Manage and maintain conservation areas that are open to the public for recreation.

Maintain donated land as a memorial to the donor, that will protect unspoiled habitat and give pleasure to the public.

PROTECTING LAND IN THE LOWER MUSKINGUM

The lower Muskingum River is arbitrarily defined as the 68 river miles from Marietta to Philo. The lower Muskingum valley very roughly describes FLMR's area of concentration. FLMR presently protects land in Washington, Morgan, and Noble Counties, and is the only land trust in these counties.

WHAT WE HAVE DONE SO FAR

As of 2020, FLMR owns 250 acres of beautiful land and protects an additional 653 acres by means of conservation easements.

We have over six miles of walking trails on property we own, open to the public.

We endeavor to limit erosion and control invasive species of plants on the land we own.

FLMR is establishing and maintaining about eight acres of pollinator habitat to help increase populations of pollinating insects.

We conduct many educational programs at summer camps and make numerous presentations to civic groups.
